Sports

Scottish Disability Sport (SDS) is the coordinating body for sports for disabled people in Scotland. They have a role in promoting and developing sports, and to help with this they have coordinators based in different areas of the country.

If you are interested in getting involved in a sport – football, athletics, swimming etc - then it is probably worthwhile speaking to the SDS coordinator in your area first.
